2010 Conclave Training Information

Lodge Chief and Adviser:

As you are probably aware by now, training for Conclave this year will be setup differently than in the past. We now have a college setup with five different majors. Each participant will work their way up from an associate's degrees, returning the next year to earn a master's degree, and the following year to not only earn a PhD but also help teach a class. Along with each college, you will earn a patch that will build on top of its self when you earn the masters and PhD degrees.

To make this a success, we need Arrowmen from every lodge that plans on taking training to preregister. This will provide a few benefits for each member: they will be able to pick from any college and the classes in that college, they will receive a schedule when they register on site, and it ensures that they will get the patch. Not only will this help the Arrowmen, but it will help the training committee with designing the master schedule.

There are two ways to preregister. The first way is if you register for Conclave online. When you do, you will be able to select the college you want to attend and three classes within that college. The second form of registration, this is when the lodge leadership comes into play, is through the lodge. I've attached a page which needs to be handed out to as many Arrowmen in your lodge that is going to Conclave. The page has a lot of information about what each college offers and a spot for them to pick their college and class. They will need to mail/email this information of which class they want to take back to the lodge chief or adviser. On **March 31st** you will need to submit a master roster of who is taking what. I've also attached a sample table for you to fill in with this information.

I know this will involve more work for the lodges, but it is to help make sure that our new training program runs smoothly. If you have any questions, do not hesitate to ask.
