2004 CONCLAVE SERVICE FLAP REQUIREMENTS

For the upcoming SR-6N Section Conclave, Kawida Lodge has produced a limited edition "Service Flap" that will be available to its members who satisfy certain eligibility requirements. The Lodge Executive Committee (LEC) has approved and set forth these requirements.

The lodge will offer the service flap to those of its members that give service in specific ways before, during, and after the Conclave. Note*: every member of the lodge will be eligible to earn at least one of these service flaps just by attending and participating at the Conclave. Additional flaps may be earned according to the following guidelines, which were determined to let you know how many flaps that you can purchase:

- (Purchase 1st Flap) Attend the Conclave and participate
- (Purchase 2nd Flap) Attend and work at two (2) of the scheduled four (4) workdays
 - (Purchase 3rd Flap) Actively serve on a committee's)
- (Purchase 4th Flap) Stay to help clean up after the Conclave

After everyone gets what they are eligible for, members can purchase an additional flap on a single file format until there are fewer flaps remaining than members willing to purchase them. The remaining balance of flaps will then be sold on a raffle basis. Meaning that every member still wishing to purchase one of the remaining flaps, will have their name placed in a hat to be drawn out until all of the remaining flaps are sold.


LAKOTA CHAPTER NEWS

Since Kawida Lodge is the host lodge for this event, there is much preparation to do. We've already formed committees, and have had some interest in filling them. Do not let this event go by without getting involved in some way. A lot of the fun and reward will come from being part of a team of Arrowmen serving to pull this event together. Take a look at the following committees and decide to which you can and would like to contribute. Most committees will be meeting during planned lodge events like the workdays scheduled in December, March and April. As a youth led organization, it is very important that the lodge has some youth members that will step up and assist in this important endeavor. The following conclave committees have been formed, and are in need of being completely filled:

Logistics/Service Corps – This workhorse committee is responsible for camp facilities, setting up for events (i.e. training, shows, American Indian Events, Quest, etc...), setting up and maintaining campsites/ buildings, meeting the needs of section conclave committees, and running the camp Quartermaster.

Parking and Security – This committee is responsible for seeing to it that 600 participants get parked on Friday night, their gear gets to the campsites, that the vehicles get out of campsites, and that a security presence is maintained throughout weekend.

Foodservice – This committee is responsible for providing all meals to participants.

Trading Post/Concessions – This committee operates the lodge trading post and concession stands.

Hospitality – This committee operates hospitality and information booths to help participants feel welcomed at Camp McKee.

Registration/Finance – This committee is responsible for registering all participants, printing name badges, checking in everyone on Friday night, maintaining control of budget and payments, tracking registration fees, all section trading post pre-orders, and balancing the budget after the event is over.

As you can see, this is going to be a BIG event, but we will have a great deal of fun as we serve cheerfully together. None of the committees are full to date, so we still need you. Even if you serve on a committee, you will still be able to participate in the conclave events.
